TO EXTEND UG RULES & REGULATIONS, 2016 TO DEGREE 2013 AND 2014 BATCH STUDENTS (THREE YEAR DEGREE PROGRAM) TO CLEAR THEIR BACKLOG COURSES
Some students of Degree-2013 batch (three year program) have submitted thei applications that to clear their backlog courses / subjects, they may be given one special chance.
In this regard, it is brought out that the maximum duration of degree three year program is five years. It is pertinent to mention here that, UG Rules & Regulations, 2016, were extended to Degree 2012 batch students by the Senate, vide Item No. 20.6 in its 20 <sup>th</sup> meeting held on 15.01.2018. It is proposed that the same rules (in terms of maximum duration) may be extended to UG-2013 & 2014 (three year degree program) students, as the three year degree program has since been phased out.

TO CONSIDER REQUEST OF MR. RESHAM SINGH, A STUDENT OF DEGREE-2014 BATCH, FOR PERMISSION TO REGISTER IN SIXTH SEMESTER IN AUGUST, 2019
A student of Degree-2014 batch, Mr. Resham Singh (GWT/101108) vide his application dated 28.03.2019, has submitted that he was granted permission by the Institute to drop his sixth semester starting from January, 2017, on the grounds that he had joined the Punjab Police on 22.11.2016. Vide letter dated 03.01.2018, he was granted permission by the academic section to register in the sixth semester starting from January, 2018 However, he could not complete the required formalities, due to certain reasons beyond his control.

His case was referred to HOD (Mech Engg) for specific recommendation. The DAAC of Mech Engg department held its meeting on 29.03.2019, and has recommended that under special circumstances and keeping in view the career of Mr. Resham Singh, he may be granted extension of one year and allowed to register in 6 <sup>th</sup> semester in August, 2019, under self-study mode, as three-year degree program has been phased out. The student has submitted that he can take leave from his employer for four months from August, 2019 to November, 2019.

TO CONSIDER RELAXATION IN MANDATORY ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT BY THE STUDENTS OF VARIOUS PROGRAMS The existing rules of attendance are re-produced as under :-
"The students are expected to be present in every lecture/tutorial/laboratory/ workshop/drawing class. The students must have a minimum attendance of 75% of the total number of scheduled classes in a particular course, in order to be eligible to appear in the End Term Examination. The student should meet this attendance requirement irrespective of number of days he/she is on medical leave, on leave while participation in activities like sports, cultural, NCC, NSS or any other genuine ground whatsoever. The mass bunk shall be treated as absent in a particular class on a particular day and shall be counted towards the delivered lecture/tutorial/laboratory/workshop/drawing class.
Further, in exceptional cases, Chairman, Senate (Director, SLIET) may give additional relaxation (upto 10% of the total scheduled classes) on the specific recommendation of the respective HOD and Dean (Academics)".
During the current semester end term examinations, some students requested for attendance relaxation in the range of 12% to 13%. The matter was put up to the competent authority and approved as under :-
"In such cases, where proper recommendation from the department has been received for relaxation of attendance, students may be allowed to appear provisionally in the examination. Their answer sheets may be kept in a separate envelop and cases will be put up to the Senate for decision. Further course of action will be taken on the basis of decision by the Senate. All such candidates will submit an undertaking that their appearance in the examination is provisional and they will abide by the Senate decision".
A notice in this regard stands already issued by the Academic Section vide Ref. No. SLIET/AS/2985 dated 13.05.2019, addressed to all HODs.
