ITEM 34.9 TO CONSIDER AND APPROVE AMENDMENTS TO THE ORDINANCES AND RULES & REGULATIONS FOR Ph. D. PROGRAMMES, 2018

The MOM of the Central Research Committee of the Institute, held on 16.08.2021, were ratified by the Senate in its 32nd meeting held on 24.08.2021.

However, it was resolved that Dean (R&C) be requested to constitute a committee:

- i) To review the progress of Ph. D. candidates in every semester till submission of the thesis;
- ii) To review the policy for adding co-supervisor within a stipulated / rationale time frame.
- iii) The external member, Prof. Siddhartha Sarkar, suggested to involve an expert from the industry.

In compliance to the above decision of the 32nd Senate, Dean (R&C) vide office order No. 2209 dated 16.11.2021, had constituted a committee to give its recommendations on the issues referred above.

The recommendations of the committee are proposed as under :-

(A) Monitoring the progress of research scholars after every six months till submission of thesis

The RAC will normally consist of the Supervisor and Co-Supervisor (if any) and two faculty members conversant with the field of research. The Co-Supervisor and/or member of the RAC may be from outside the Institute. The Research Supervisor of the scholar shall be the Convener of this Committee. The names of the RAC members and any subsequent changes in its composition shall be communicated by the DRC to the CRC for record. The RAC is expected to monitor the progress of the candidate until the completion of the programme. This Committee shall have the following responsibilities:</p> <p>(i) To review the research proposal and finalize the topic of research;</p> <p>(ii) To guide the research scholar to develop the study design and methodology of research and identify the course(s) that he/she may have to do.</p> <p>(iii) To periodically review and assist in the progress of the research work of the research scholar.</p>	<p>5.2 : RAC/PC and DRC concerned will monitor progress of research scholars after every six months (half yearly) till the submission of thesis instead of Annual progress seminars. 


