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

**HELD AT 3.00 P. M. ON 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2022 (Monday)**



Program (Welding &amp; Fabrication) in the Academic Session 2018-2019. As per rules and regulations of the PG Program, he was required to complete the program upto July, 2022. The details of the case are as under:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Pre-submission of Thesis was held on 30.06.2021.</li> <li>- M.Tech. Viva was conducted on 22.07.2021.</li> <li>- The Mechanical Department has submitted the Thesis Evaluation Report and Examiner Report (after viva voce) on <b>06.12.2022</b> i.e. after lapse of more than 01 year &amp; 04 months after conduct of Viva Voce.</li> <li>- The Thesis has been recommended for award of M.Tech. Degree with modification suggested during Viva Voce Examination, in the Examiner Report.</li> <li>- Mr.Rachit Kumar submitted an application dated 25.11.2022 through the Department of Mechanical Engineering for consideration, in which he mentioned that during the Viva Voce, he was suggested to submit his thesis after some changes. Thereafter, he got infected from COVID along-with some of his family members. After recovery from COVID, he joined a job due to financial conditions of his family. That after starting job, it became harder for him to focus on thesis due to workload in job. He further requested for allowing the submission of his thesis, taking into consideration of his family's health and financial condition.</li> </ul> <p>As per the Rules &amp; Regulations applicable to 2018 batch admitted students, the maximum duration for completion of M.Tech. Program is four years (Clause no. PG 2.4). 		Thereafter, in the year 2022, a committee was constituted to relax the conditions of paper publications for extension of fellowship for 4 <sup>th</sup> and 5 <sup>th</sup> year. 

	A Meeting of the committee, constituted for Internship Guidelines formulation was held on 27.01.2023 in the Training & Placement Department. The recommendations of the committee are available at <b>Annexure-K (Page 69 to 73).</b>
	The recommendations of the committee were discussed and the competent authority (Chairman, Senate) approved the following modifications:
1.	The proposed modification in rule UG 26.1 (vii), now UG 14.1 (vii), is already inbuilt in the rules as students can add or drop a subject as per the dates notified in the academic calendar. However, as per said rule, if a student discontinues the internship, then he/ she will be given an 'E' grade, which needs to be modified. In such cases, if the period spent in industry is less than 75% of the prescribed period, he/ she should be awarded an 'F' grade.
2.	The proposed modifications in the rule 26.1 (if), now UG 14 (iv), are not required as the students with backlogs may not be able to appear for a repeat or retest in case they proceed for an internship and may not be able to complete the degree on time.
3.	The proposed modifications in the rule 26.3 (I), now UG 14.3 (I), are the procedural part regarding allocating the faculty mentor on the ERP portal that can be notified separately or may be in-built in the rules.
4.	The proposed modifications in the rule 26.4 (IIIC), now UG 14.3 (IIIC), is not logical, as the Rubrics-4 (feedback from industry) should be mandatory for objective evaluation of the internship. Further, the weightage for the rubrics-4 in the overall evaluation of the internship is only 10% (20% in End Semester Examination). However, in rare cases, when the rubrics-4 is not available, the evaluation criteria can be decided on case to case basis.
